

2024 Septuagint Summer Course The Septuagint and Law

With the translation of the Torah from Hebrew into Greek, Greek-speaking Jewish communities could now reflect on the applicability and reach of this version of Sacred Law. Our course proposes to deal with two questions:

- What range of translational approaches were taken to produce a Greek version of the Torah, and what did it communicate as a legal document?
 - Greek legal sources in circulation at the time of translating the Pentateuch will be read and explored alongside the Septuagint's use of legal terminology.
- What do we know about the conception of "Law" held by Greek-speaking Jewish communities? We plan to study the theological value, reception and implementation of Jewish law in Greek during the Hellenistic Period.
